## Corporal Thomas Kennedy, 15137. 9<sup>th</sup> Battalion the Yorkshire Regiment.



Thomas was born in 1882 in Seaham Harbour, and up to 1915 had been employed as a bottlemaker and in the mines at Seaham.

He joined the Yorkshire Regiment in 1915, and served as a corporal in D Company, 9th Battalion Yorkshire Regiment. Their orders for departure to France were received at Bramshot on 23rd August 1915, and they mobilised to Boulogne via Liphook and Folkstone. After a short instruction in trench warfare at Rue Delpierre, they moved into 3rd line trenches on the Bois Grenier line on 18th September, where a shrapnel injury gave their first casualty on 29th September.

Up to 11th December, they spent approximately 25 days in the trenches, until Thomas was killed at T47/48/49/50/51. His death is the only casualty recorded for the Company on that day.

His grave is at the Brewery Orchard Cemetery in Bois Grenier, mid way between the front line and the billet positions at Rue Marle.

Below is a summary of the Battalion War Diary for the time that Corporal Kennedy served with the 9th Battalion until the day that he was killed. Attached to it is a copy of the trench map for the area.
